Reimbursement Procedure



If you want to be reimbursed for money spent on behalf of Altrusa here is the procedure: Login to our website. Click "Member-only Access" and select "Financial Reports". The first item is "Check Request Form". Print the form.

Complete the top section. Check the box for the type of expense, Foundation or Administrative; check the project/line item the money is to come from. Sign and date the form at the bottom as the Submitting Member. Ask the budget chair of your committee to sign and date. This process will ensure your committee stays within its budget. The co-chairs designated one person as "budget chair" at the beginning of the year.

If your request is for Administrative Funds, send or give the completed form and receipt(s) to **Jean Stuart, Administration Treasurer.** If your request is for Foundation Funds, send or give the completed form and receipt(s) to **Cindy Murray, Foundation Treasurer**.

AIR Time with Richardson Read One Book

Season 7 of AIR Time presented by AIR (Arts Incubator of Richardson) kicks off on September 14 at Alamo Drafthouse in Richardson, at 7:00 p.m. as we interview Dr. Robert Gregg—Assistant Professor of Bioengineering and Mechanical Engineering and the Director of the Locomotor Control Systems Laboratory at the University of Texas at Dallas. His research concerns the control mechanisms of human

locomotion with applications to high-performance prosthetic and orthotic devices.

This special Season 7 opener for AIR Time is in partnership with the Richardson Reads One Book program where the focus is on encouraging an entire community to read the same book then come together to discuss it, share ideas and experience a presentation by the author. This year's selection is Spare Parts by Joshua Davis. The book centers on four Latino teenagers in Arizona who enter a national underwater robotics competition.
