Altrusa Scholarship Applications Now Available

Applications for the Altrusa International Scholarship and the Jo Leeper Memorial Scholarship are now available on the Altrusa Richardson website. To be eligible to apply, students must be graduating seniors who attend a RISD high school or reside in the City of Richardson and attend a public high school.

Scholarships are awarded based on financial need, grades, as well as extracurricular and community activities. In addition to the application, students must submit a transcript of grades and a short essay describing their career goals and why they are applying for the scholarship. All applications are done online and are due no later than February 17.

From the applications submitted, the Scholarship Committee will interview 10-15 students they feel are the best candidates. After the interviews, the Committee will determine how many scholarships to award and the amount given.

This year, \$10,000 will be awarded for Altrusa Scholarships and \$3,000 for the one Jo Leeper Memorial Scholarship.

Recipients will honored at the April 20 Dinner Meeting.

Sembach Elementary School in Sembach, Germany is the newest location for a Choose Kind Library. It opened in January, right after the students returned from Christmas break.

This elementary school services students from ages 3 to 11 who come from Sembach Kaserne (formerly called Sembach Air Base). Sembach Kaserne is part of a U.S. Army Installation and is about 19 miles east of Ramstein Air Base and Sembach Elementary is a member of the DoDEA Europe East District which serves military connected children. According to their librarian, Jodi Benavides, the students were so excited to see the books

as they entered the library and have already checked out over a third of the books.

Because books and the stories they convey have the capacity to open family discussions on potentially difficult topics such as family separation, deployment, moving, grief, and crisis, our Altrusa club hopes these books can help make a difference in these children's lives.

The Kindness Committee has been hard at work. We have been in conversation with The Richardson Animal Shelter, The Richardson Humane Society, Mazies Mission, Furry Friends of Richardson and Chewys about our project coming up April 1st - **Kindness to Animals.** What other group needs our help more right now than those who cannot speak or help themselves? Dogs who were adopted during the epidemic are being dumped off again and each spring approximately 70 litters of kittens arrive at the shelter - that's about 420 kittens that need fostering,

So, we will have a large adoption portion of the day on the parking lot near Chocolate Angel (Corner of Floyd and Campbell) so we get lots of drive-by attention. Homemade doggie treats will be for sale and vendors will have tables to hand out coupons etc. Plus, there will be many dogs and cats available for folks to adopt. Other projects will be happening at Friends Place too.

We are also putting together kitten kits for all those annual spring births. These kits will be given to foster moms with items needed to raise the kittens to the point they can be adopted. Children in our Choose Kind library schools will have an opportunity to visit an animal at the shelter and write a note about it to hang on the adoptee's

cage to help people learn more about the animal and continues our focus on literacy!

We are not requiring each committee to find an individual project - **the animals are the main focus** and we'd love 100% participation.

So much more is planned so stay tuned and think about how YOU can help!
