As of June 2022, there is an estimated 100 million people in the world who are forced to leave their homes due to conflict, climate, human rights violations, and persecution. This year in Ukraine, UNICEF has reached 2.8 million people with lifesaving health and medical supplies and helped over 610,000 children and needs for these people keep increasing every day. Altrusa International has awarded 57 grants to Altrusa Clubs and 2 to Club 21 International projects for a total of \$166.447. Our club is among the recipients. We will be receiving a grant for \$3,156 which will allow our Kindness Committee to set up new Choose Kind Libraries at the following 4 RISD Elementary Schools: Aiken, Thurgood Marshall, Forest Lane Academy, and Springridge Elementary.

In addition to these local schools, we will be able to move forward with another international Choose Kind Library located in Malawi (Africa) at the One Heart Secondary School. There will be additional funds available to help existing Choose Kind Libraries refurbish their existing libraries. The wonder of kindness continues to be our message to the community and the world at large.
